Hub's Berklee to offer free music resources online

The Berklee School of Music has decided to share its musical wealth online, at a time when the recording industry is taking music fans to court for downloading free music.

This week, the Back Bay music college began "Berklee Shares," a free online offering of classes that opens up its curriculum in instrumental performance, writing and producing music, music technology and other classes.

The project is designed both to expand on Berklee's mission of spreading music through the world and to spark an international discussion on the contentious issue of file-sharing.

"We see the Internet as a tremendous opportunity to distribute music education," said David Kusek, Berklee's associate vice president.

"It's a free offer of music to the world. Our object is to offer something of value. Not everyone who wants to is able to come to Berklee."

Berklee also is offering an online course on "the future of music and the music business" that will look specifically at the file-sharing issue and how the music industry might adapt to changing technology in a way that benefits artists, fans and the recording industry.

Berklee officials hope to engage musicians, producers and fans from around the world in the discussion.

"We think suing people is not the best approach to the problem," Kusek said.

The Berklee lessons can be freely downloaded, copied and exchanged through file-sharing networks such as Kazaa and LimeWire.

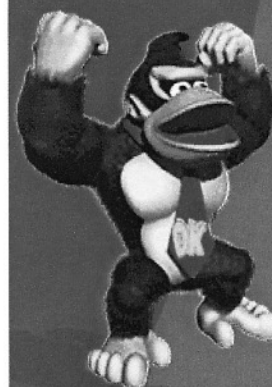


